- B. Alternative Learning Mrs. Angela Hite-Carter Executive Director of Student Support and Alternative Services

Mrs. Hite-Carter presented the update. It included alternative learning, student progress, service highlights, data trends, parents and community, and scope of impact. Alternative learning services include modified instructional practices, appropriate social support systems, relationship and trust building and tier model framework. Tier level interventions and service outcomes were reviewed. Alternative services also includes student progress with alternative methods of instruction, adaptive classroom environments, and flexible scheduling. The District provides seven unique alternative learning experiences for students and offers extended learning environment that are conducive to the educational and social needs of the student. Data trends include weekly monitoring consisting of parent/student orientations, intakes, auditing compliance, attendance, credits earned student transitions, and student persistence. Monthly, mid-year, and annual reporting include student progress, assessing new benchmarks, grant regulations and contract guideline, goal attainment, grant objectives met, and contract objectives met. Parents attend 100% of student intake orientations. Parents and staff partner at open houses, and parent teacher conferences. The scope of impact includes transitioning, students completing their program of study, regaining on-track status, and earning grade promotion. Impact also included credit earning and graduation.
