B. Rockford Board of Education School District #205 Health Care Plan Document

Approval of the document will enable Administration to update and comply with the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and clarifications on changes to benefits and coverage information.

C. Board Policy 2.100 Board of Education; Board Member Conflict of Interest

The Policy is updated to align with the federal regulations requiring written standards of conduct covering conflicts of interest and governing the actions of those engaged in the selection, award, and administration of contracts in compliance with 2 C.F.R. §200.318.

D. Board Policy 2.220 Board of Education; Board Meeting Procedure

The Policy is updated to align with 5 ILCS 120/2.06 The intent of the in the presence of language is meant to protect both (1) the verbatim recordings/closed session minutes, and (2) the board members requesting access to them. The requirement is meant to prevent misuse and removal of the verbatim recording/closed session minutes from the district offices or official storage location. It is also meant to protect the board member who requests the access from being alone and in a situation where he or she could potentially be accused of tampering with or taking the verbatim recording/closed session minutes.

E. Board Policy 4.10 Operational Services; Fiscal and Business Management

The Policy is updated to require all employees, contractors and agents using the District's electronic equipment to complete an Authorization for Use of Electronic Networks and Technology form.

F. Board Policy 4.60 Operational Services; Purchases and Contracts

The Policy is revised to align with 105 ILCS 5/10-20.21(b-10), which prohibits any contract to purchase food with a bidder or offeror if the bidder's or offeror's contract terms prohibits the school from donating food to food banks, including, but not limited to, homeless shelters, food pantries, and soup kitchens.

G. Board Policy 4.110 Operational Services; Transportation

Policy language is added to require foster care students be transported in accordance with Section 6312(c)(5)(B) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. 105 ILCS 5/10-20.5

H. Board Policy 5.10 General Personnel; Equal Employment Opportunities and Minority Recruitment

The Policy is updated to prohibit discrimination based upon an individual's order of protection status. 775 ILCS 5/1-103(Q). Also, language was added indicating, according to the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, all employers must verify that employees are either U.S. citizens or authorized to work in the U.S. 8 U.S.C. §§1324(a) et seq. 775 ILCS 5/1-102(C).

In addition, language was added to indicate discrimination on the basis of a request for or use of a reasonable accommodation is a civil rights violation under the Illinois Human Rights Act. Most discrimination laws prohibit retaliation against employees who oppose practices made unlawful by those laws, including, for example, the EEOA, Title IX, ADA, ADEA, Victims' Economic Security and Safety Act, the III. Equal Pay Act, and the III. Whistleblower Act. 775 ILCS 5/6-101

I. Board Policy 5.20 General Personnel; Workplace Harassment Prohibited

The Policy has been revised to align with amendments to the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act, 5 ILCS 430/70-5(a) which require school districts to have a policy prohibiting sexual harassment which must include, at a minimum: (1) a prohibition on sexual harassment; (2) details on how an individual can report an allegation of sexual harassment, including options for making a confidential report to a supervisor, ethics officer, Inspector General, or the III. Dept. of Human Rights; (3) a prohibition on retaliation for reporting sexual harassment allegations, including availability of whistleblower protections under the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act, the Whistleblower Act (740 ILCS 174/), and the III. Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/); and (4) the consequences of a violation of the prohibition on sexual harassment and the consequences for knowingly making a false report.

J. Board Policy 5.90 General Personnel; Abused and Neglected Child Reporting

The policy is updated in response to 105 ILCS 5/10-23.12(b) to includes more hotline numbers and a directive for school employees to immediately call 911 if they believe a student is in immediate danger of harm.

K. Board Policy 5.100 General Personnel; Staff Development Program

The policy is updated to incorporate trainings mandated by Illinois law including 1. training for school nutrition program directors 2. Ongoing professional development regarding the adverse consequences of school exclusion and justice-system involvement, effective classroom management strategies, culturally responsive discipline and developmentally appropriate disciplinary methods 105 ILCS 5/10-22.6(c-5) 3. Incorporate training mandates added to the Youth Sports Concussion Safety Act, 105 ILCS 5/22-80.
